EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES POLICY

The Longwell Green & Kingswood Performing Arts Festival offers a wide range of classes in Musical Theatre, Music, Speech, Drama and Dance. The purpose of the Festival is to encourage performance in such a way which cultivates a love for performing arts.

There are no restrictions but to facilitate this in a competitive environment, it is often necessary for sections to present performers in age grouped classes. The Committee is prepared to consider the introduction of classes that would further diversify the type of performance subject to their artistic merit.

GENERAL RULES

It is stressed that teachers MUST bring these rules to the notice of all performers

- Any performers who are attending, or have attended, Vocational Training Colleges are ineligible to enter. For performers aged 18 and under (or 25 and under in the Vocal section and open classes in Speech and Drama), age will be reckoned as of 31st August 2024.
- This year we will continue to use online entry for all classes. So please use the relevant online entry form on the website for your section. It is easy and calculates the prices for you and we will email you a detailed acknowledgement. But if that is not possible then please contact us and we will make the entry on your behalf. Details of the dates and times of your performances will be emailed to you at a later date and therefore we will not use tickets this year. Performers will be admitted free of charge.
- Entrants will perform in the order determined by the Committee and shown in the programme. Performers who fail to respond may forfeit a hearing, unless the Secretary has been informed prior to the start of the class.
- Should entrants be unable to perform, substitute performers are NOT allowed.
- An entry isn't registered until the correct fee is received. This year payment can be made preferably by BACS or by cheque if necessary. Details will be on the acknowledgement email. Any refunds will be at the discretion of the Committee

- Performers will be marked in accordance with the recommendations of the British and International Federation of Festivals as described above. In any Music, Speech and Drama sections, performers must obtain at least 81 marks to qualify for a medal and 84 marks for a trophy. Any Dance performer must obtain 84 marks to qualify for a trophy. THE ADJUDICATOR WILL ANNOUNCE THE FIRST 3 MARKS.
- The Secretary reserves the right to limit the number of entrants in all classes, to ensure that each performer may receive a fair hearing.
- Adjudicators may stop any performance when their judgement has been formed. Their decision is final
- Any protest which a performer or any other person, may wish to make, must be in writing and accompanied by a £10 deposit. Should the Committee, after investigation not uphold the protest, the deposit will be forfeited.
- All trophies are awarded for 11 months and MUST be returned in good condition to the relevant Entry Secretary, not later than 4 weeks before the commencement of the Festival.
- The Committee reserves the right to qualify the rules or determine any other Regulation as circumstances require.
- Entrants must perform only ONCE in a solo class and must not perform the same work in more than one class. In other sections, performers may enter more than once in a duet, trio or group but with different partners and/or work.
- In each section a Set Piece cannot also be an Own Choice piece.
- In all Own Choice classes, previous winners may not compete again with the same material.
- In all Own Choice classes, copies of the manuscripts/poem/prose must be provided for the Adjudicator, together with the source and publisher, or a mark will not be given.
- The Committee CANNOT permit the PHOTOGRAPHING or RECORDING (audio or video) of any performance.
- Recorded accompaniment is only permitted generally in Dance (see separate Dance Rules). In other sections recorded accompaniment is only permitted if it is defined in the description of a specific class and subject to copyright consideration.
- All performances using music from shows in current production are subject to copyright law and
 may only be performed as a concert item (i.e. with no props, costume or movement), without the
 need for copyright permission. Where movement or costume are included in a performance,
 copyright permission is required. The Festival accepts these entries on the basis that the
 appropriate copyright permission has been sought. Performers or teachers with queries on how to
 obtain permission for performance items should contact Festivals House on 01625 428297 before
 making entries.
- All music, characterisation and dances should be age appropriate and will be marked accordingly.
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entries without assigning a reason.

LONGWELL GREEN & KINGSWOOD PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm.

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

CREATING SAFER FESTIVALS FOR EVERYONE

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create **Safer Festivals** for everyone:

- A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival. At Longwell Green & Kingswood Performing Arts Festival Kathy Goodspeed is our Safeguarding Officer details on information page.
- Best practice advice in the form of **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection leaflets**, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending and/or performing at a Federation Festival.
- All Festival personnel wear an official badge. All teachers, parents, guardians and carers are
 asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a badge. All reported incidents
 will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child
 Protection best practice advice. In addition we will ensure the availability of a quiet area or
 room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- For the duration of a festival all teachers, parents, guardians, and carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their

- children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take responsibility for any property left unattended.
- No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case we ask the responsible teachers, parents, guardians or carers to contact the Festival Secretary prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus and Programme. By completing and signing the entry form all parents, guardians, carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without this consent entries to the Festival cannot be accepted.

PRIVACY NOTICE

The Longwell Green & Kingswood Performing Arts Festival is a performing arts organisation run entirely by volunteers and registered with the Charity Commission (No 1043870). It is a member of the British & International Federation of Festivals.

This privacy policy explains how we use any personal information we collect about you:

What information do we collect about you?

We collect information about you when you register to compete in the Festival, apply to become a member of the Festival/Friend of the Festival or volunteer as a steward and also if you voluntarily complete surveys or give feedback. We will only ask for such information as is necessary for the efficient administration of the festival. We do not collect 'sensitive personal data' unless there is a legitimate reason for this – where an entrant may need support to participate in a class.

How will we use the information about you?

We collect information about you in order to process your entry to classes in the Festival and for any other administrative functions of the Festival.

Access to this data will be restricted to those personnel who administer the Festival.

Access to your data and correction

You have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you. This can be obtained, free of charge, by application to Kathy Goodspeed (Gen.Sec.) (kathygoodspeed@hotmail.co.uk We want to make sure that your personal information is accurate and up to date and all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure this is the case. You may ask us to correct or remove information you think is inaccurate.

Do we share this information with anyone else?

The Festival will not pass collected data to any third party unless required to do so by law, but it should be noted that names (only) of competitors will appear in the Festival programme.

ADJUDICATORS

MUSIC: MICHAEL JOHNSON

B.Mus (London), PGCE (Cambridge), ARCM (piano), ARCM (singing)

Michael studied singing, violin and piano at the Royal College of Music and at Cambridge where he became a choral exhibitioner at Jesus College.

For the past fifty years he has taught gifted young people during which time many have gone on to professional careers in music. He was formerly consultant in singing, violin and piano at the Universities of Bath and Plymouth and has been a practical examiner and mentor for ABRSM for forty-five years, during which time he examined in more than twenty countries overseas.

Michael has also spent some of his career as an administrator: during the 1980/90s he was Chief Music Manager for Leeds City Council, General Manager of St. David's Hall Cardiff and Director of Plymouth Pavilions in Devon.

Presently he is Director of the Devizes Eisteddfod, an eight day competitive festival in Wiltshire. In 2022 he retired as a member of the adjudicators' panel of the British & International Federation of Festivals, after 25 years service.

Throughout his career Michael has directed choirs: until June 2023 he was Director of the West Devon Chorale in Plymouth and is presently Director of the Philomel Singers, a female choir based in Trowbridge.

SPEECH, DRAMA & MUSICAL THEATRE:

VIVIENNE REDFORD LLAM, FRSA, MSTSD. (Adj.)

Vivienne has studied Speech and Drama since the age of four and has been teaching the subject since 1980. She is Head of Speech and Drama at an independent girls' school in Bedford. She is also the Principal of the Redford School of Speech and Drama, established in 1982, training children and adults of all ages in all aspects of the performing arts and communication. Many of her former students perform in TV, fiim and theatre around the world and in major West End productions, The Globe, the RSC and the National Theatre. Others are pursuing careers as teachers of Speech and Drama, Theatre Directors and Technicians.

Vivienne has produced and directed a diverse range of musical and theatrical productions, and particularly enjoys writing and devising original and creative theatre with her senior students. For the past twenty years, she has organised and directed a widely acclaimed summer schools for students aged 7 - 21, which culminates in a commissioned play written for, and performed by, the students who attend.

Vivienne is an examiner for the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art, a member of the Society of Teachers of Speech and Drama and an Adjudicator member of the British & International Federation of Festivals, travelling extensively throughout the UK, Ireland and the Channel Islands. She is currently a Speech and Drama representative on the Adjudicators' Council.

She has recently been awarded a Fellowship of the Royal Society of Arts in recognition of her extensive work in Speech and Drama, particularly with young people.

She is a former Secretary and now Vice-President of the Bedfordshire Festival of Music, Speech and Drama which has given her clear understanding and insight into the work, energy and commitment that Festival organisers, teachers and pupils put into making their Festivals a success.

While not working (which is a rare occurrence) Vivienne enjoys seeing as much theatre as possible, reading, particularly books for children and young adults, cooking and relishes spending time with her family.

She is looking forward to adjudicating at the Festival and hopes that it will be a memorably and happy occasion for all those taking part.

MUSICAL THEATRE SUNDAY 27TH OCTOBER 2024

The emphasis is on a complete performance and presentation, rather than solely a study of music and will show ability in acting, singing, dancing and choreographic skills. Performances must show implicit dramatic content with portrayal of characters and their motivations. This is an opportunity to explore style, form and character through communicating the dramatic context of a musical text. Extracts from plays may be edited to create dialogue moving into musical scenes.

A CD player is provided. All performance must be from memory and clearly introduced. Please note some classes may take place in the evening. We reserve the right to cancel classes, restrict the number of entries into classes or limit audience numbers should it be necessary. Please check the website for regular updates.

COPYRIGHT

The Festival does not accept liability for the infringement of copyright recording or performing rights arising out of an entrant's accompaniment or performance. It contributes to a group licence to cover payment of fees for the use of recorded music at its events. Teachers and Choreographers using tapes created from commercial recordings are advised that they are themselves responsible for seeking permission to re-record from the recording companies concerned. A copy of the musical track you will be using should be sent in advance. The CD should contain one musical track only. All CD's should be clearly marked with the class/number of the entrant. Minimal props and a suggestion of costume essential to the action of the character may be used. N.B. full stage costume is discouraged and may contravene copyright.

Please provide a copy of the script and music for the Adjudicator and a further copy of the script for the CD operator.

Time limits must be strictly observed. Introductions are not included in the time limit. 2 minutes are allowed for set up.
